A recap on some of our mission efforts at Christmas

The annual **Christmas dinner** at our church on Christmas day fed over 120 people who enjoyed gathering together for that festive meal.

Not only that, but many more people also will be fed as a result of that meal – because 16 half-steamer pans of turkey casserole and five of ham casserole were created from the leftovers! Each casserole (which also includes stuffing, pasta, or mashed potato) will serve 10 people. Since our church provides a hot evening meal for the Emergency Overflow Shelter every Saturday during the winter months, those casseroles will be put to good use to feed the shelter's 19 consumers and their several staff members. The motto of our food prep crew: waste not, want not!

Also, many children in the area served by the **Albany United Methodist Society** received Christmas presents, thanks to the generosity of our congregation. We lost track of the number of heavy cartons of toys, hats, mittens, gloves, scarves, and gift certificates that were transported to AUMS in the weeks prior to Christmas. Parents were able to "shop" without cost for gifts for their children, gifts that otherwise would have been unobtainable. Thank you for caring - and for sharing!

And, thanks, too, to everyone who purchased **Angel Tree** gifts. Once again, our church's generosity was overwhelming. The gifts we provided went to the adults and one child who are living in the Support Ministries residential program. All of the adults in this program are dealing with HIV/AIDS, and for many of them, these gifts were their only Christmas gifts.

Overflow shelter needs

The Overflow Shelter, operated by the Capital Area Council of Churches in partnership with the First Lutheran Church in Albany, serves individuals who cannot stay at other shelters because of mental health issues such as bipolar disorder and substance abuse. The shelter provides overnight lodging, a hot evening meal, a simple breakfast, laundry service, and referrals for health care needs. Since the shelter initially opened several years ago, our church has contributed money toward its operating expenses. We also have provided Christmas gifts. Most recently, we provided heavyweight "hoodies" and gift bags. Each gift bag contained personal care items such as lip balm, hand lotion, and nail clippers, disposable hand warmers, candy (for energy), and a heavy scarf. Such simple items carry the message that someone cares.
